



The program is designed to increase awareness of the consequences of crime both for the offender and victim. The presentation includes a video depicting what happens when school children steal a few items for a store, from arrest and appearance in court. The program has reached over 3700 students in over 70 schools since it started in 2003.

As part of the anti-shoplifting program, the Elizabeth Fry Society of Saint John has published a booklet entitled “Shoplifting: the Crime of the Century”. The booklet contains stories and information on shoplifting as well as puzzles and activities to engage the students. It is an engaging and eye-catching way to teach the students about the consequences of crimes such as shoplifting. Each student taking the program receives a booklet.



The Anti-Shoplifting program is run for grade 5 students in school districts 6 and 8.
